Superficial, red, sometimes painful.

SECOND DEGREE (*Partial Thickness*)
Skin may be red, blistered, swollen.
Very painful.

THIRD DEGREE (*Full Thickness*)
Whitish, charred or translucent, no
pin prick sensation in burned area.

*American Burn Association
identifies the following:*

- Partial Thickness > 10% TBSA
- Any Full Thickness
- Circumferential burns
- Burns to the face, hands, feet, genitalia, perineum, joints
- Electrical injury, including lightning
- Inhalation injuries
- Chemical injuries
- Burn injury in patients with pre-existing medical disorders that could complicate management, prolong recover, or affect mortality
